Trever Campbell – University of Oregon



Trever is a graduate student and teaching fellow in the Master of Accounting program at the University of Oregon. He is pursuing the CPA track to have a direct impact on the future direction of global business and is particularly interested in the emerging field of environmental accounting.

Trever earned his bachelor's in Accounting from Southern Oregon University where he was president of the Accounting Students Association, organized the accounting tutoring program for business students, and studied abroad at HTW des Saarlandes business school in Germany.
